

KCSB News: How to Produce Zoom Interviews for Broadcast & Podcasts

Zoom is teleconferencing software that is offered free (for meeting/interviews up to 40 minutes) or for a monthly fee (unlimited recording/meeting lengths). UCSB students & staff have access to the pro version of zoom (<https://ucsb.zoom.us/> -- click SIGN IN on the right side, and use your NET ID log-in credentials)

Before you start:

1. Download Zoom client/plug in on your computer and/or the app for your mobile phone:

 1. <https://ucsb.zoom.us/meeting>
 - a. Fill in form
 - b. Click COPY INVITATION to copy and paste into an email to send to your interview guest
 2. Download Audacity (free sound editing) software + the FFmpeg plug-in to your computer
 - a. Audacity free download <https://www.audacityteam.org/download/>
 - i. CHOOSE: the Audacity program for your Mac or Windows specific computer
 - ii. Download the FFmpeg add on (choose for your computer)

 3. **BEGIN THE INTERVIEW:** When you are logged in to your Zoom meeting - be sure to hit the round RECORD button on the bottom of the screen (only the meeting HOST has access to begin recording - so make sure you are the host)
 - a. You might have the option to save your sound to your computer - or to the cloud - If you will be editing on the computer you are zooming on - choose computer.
 - b. When the meeting ends - the audio will automatically download, in a time-stamped folder, to your computer it will give you the option to save it in a specific location. The default setting seems to put it in the Documents folder.

4. Find your downloaded SOUND (it will likely be named *Audio_only.mp4*) in the day/time stamped folder (see *Documents*, or where you told zoom to save it)
5. Open AUDACITY ---> hit IMPORT, select your MP4 sound → edit sound
 - a. EXPORT your interview sound as an MP3 file

Extra tip: for Converting Stereo files to Mono in Audacity.
